## Vision, Mission and Plans 2020

As this is our first edition of the Belong magazine for the year, I say “Happy New Year” everyone. But already, 2 months of the new year are almost over. Time does seem to go faster as you get older or maybe as the Church gets busier! I had a wonderful first full calendar year with you last year and all is shaping up well for a repeat this year. As we look forward to this year, I want to address the topic of Vision, Mission and Plans 2020. The reason why I want to do this is because last year, we focussed again on Vision and Mission as we came up with five strategic plans for this year and even beyond.

Now, our Vision and Mission statements are written on the windows at the front of the Church. I wonder how many of you notice them anymore or even remember what they are? Our Vision statement is the most important statement. You may ask, “What is a Vision statement and why do we need one?” In Proverbs 29:18 says, “Without a vision, the people perish.” The Hebrew word ‘paw-rah’ means “to perish”. ‘Paw-rah’ was the word used where a woman's hair was let flow out of its covering (hairband). Unconstrained in the wind her hair is directionless and blown in all directions. That’s what we are like as God’s people if we have no vision. We are all over the place, going nowhere and achieving nothing.

Vision gives us purpose and direction and the unique reason-for-being that God has called us to be as his people. In Father Stuart’s time, it was discerned that God’s purpose for us, that is, what God wanted us to be at HTK, was a “vibrant Church family with a heart and soul for people and for God.” Now, this Vision statement probably didn’t come directly from God’s throne, but no doubt, by prayer and discussion, Father Stuart and the Parish Council discerned that this is what the Lord was calling us to.

So far, in my experience, I believe that we are truly on the journey to becoming such a Church as stated in the Vision statement. I believe that HTK is indeed a vibrant, Church family. There is a wonderful sense of love, unity and welcome at HTK that I have never ever experienced in any other congregation before. There is also quite a depth of care shown by the members one to another. We are a people that does have a heart and soul for our own people. We are learning what it means to have a heart and soul for other people, particularly as we reach out to those in need with our Tuesday morning breakfasts and our new Kidz Kinect playgroup and our “Welcome to the Neighbourhood” packs. Of course, we are not perfect for we are sinners and to have a heart and soul for people must come about as a result of the Spirit of God moving within us.

We are also a people with a heart and soul for God. Unless, we have this, all of our efforts are for nothing. Our whole lives are to be lived out of love and passion for God. This comes from the fact that He is the God of love, grace, mercy and forgiveness and his focus is totally towards us. The Gospel is best explained by a downward arrow. So, at HTK, we are taking every opportunity to worship, grow in prayer and in the Holy Spirit, read and study the Word and receive the sacrament of Holy Communion, thereby expressing our love and passion for God.

“To be a vibrant Church family with a heart and soul for God” is what our Vision is. Therefore, everything we do as Church will support us in being that kind of Church that we believe God is calling us to be. This is the kind of people we want to be as God’s people. This is God’s vision that is forming among us.

If the Vision is what God is calling us to be, Mission is the things that we do to achieve our Vision. At HTK, our Mission has four points. Two of those points have growing a heart and soul for God as their focus. They are, “We love God passionately through worship”, and “We learn, teach and grow in faith.” This is why worship is essential to who we are and from that, not only learning and growing in faith, but also being able to share the knowledge of our faith with others. We not only suck it all in, we also give it out!

The other two points of our Mission statement relate to our having a heart and soul for people. They are: “We are Christ-like in the way we make Jesus known” and “We share God’s hope and promise with the world.” Therefore, as God did to us, so we reach out to others with love, grace, mercy and forgiveness and we don’t sit on the Good News for ourselves, we share it with others. As we seek to live out our Mission statement and its four points, we will find ourselves fulfilling the Vision statement and being the people God has called us to be.

In order to do those things our Mission statement calls us to do, we have five strategic plans in place. For as the old saying goes, (not in the Bible), “If you fail to plan, you plan to fail.” Each strategy helps us to fulfill our Mission statement. Strategy One emphasizes the importance of worship, the Bible and prayer. Strategy Two enables us to care well for one another. Strategy Three supports us in our outreach to the community. Strategy Four helps us to be able to promote the things we do as Church in the community thus supporting outreach. Strategy Five helps us to grow in faith by using the gifts and abilities God has given us.

On page 14 in last month’s *Belong* magazine, there is a great summary of what I have been speaking about. I hope that what I have spoken to you about has helped you to understand why we are doing what we are doing with Vision, Mission and Plans. Maybe, if you think that particularly for many years in the Church, we didn’t need such things and why do we need them now? Maybe the answer is that we are in the decline we are in as Church in the moment because we never practiced Vision, Mission and Plans in the years gone by as Church.

By the power of the Spirit of God may we move forward in our Vision, Mission and Plans for 2020 and be all that God has called us to be as His people.

# Annual Meeting

## Annual Meeting of the Parish

23 February 2020

Rev Steve Wockner opened the meeting with prayer. He then read from 1 Corinthians 12: 12 – 31 which talks about the body of Christ (the church) and how we all have a part to play depending on the gifts God has given us. We are all part of “Team HTK”, and the body needs each one of us.

Steve summarised the 2019 year and finished with this observation:

“But we cannot rest on our laurels. I’m sure that, like me, you have looked around and added 20 years to each member, and wondered about the future of HTK! Unfortunately, this is more the norm than the exception in the Anglican Church and most other mainline churches. What do we do? Stick our heads deeper in the sand and say we can’t do anything about it? Feel that as long as it is around for us, that’s all that matters? Do we feel that the task is too big, even impossible, and just give up?

I know that Jesus has said, “I will build my church”, but that does not mean we set our church on cruise control. I know that all the churches St Paul began ended up dying out, and it doesn’t mean that every congregation is to last forever. But, unless we take seriously our call to be co-labourers in mission with the Lord who is building his church, unless we press into the power and fire of the Holy Spirit to seek revival, and unless we take seriously the call of the Great Commission, this church will eventually need to form a parish with Maroochydore, then Caloundra, and then make the Diocese a whole load of money when it is sold off for its prime real estate position!

Do you want this to happen? God is moving amongst us! The future is in our hands!! We can sit on them, or use them for building up and advancement of the Kingdom of God here in this part of the world where He has planted us, if we prioritise and sacrifice. Jesus said, “No one who puts his hand to the plough and looks back is fit for service in the kingdom of God”. May we all use our hands together in the holy work that God is doing among us”

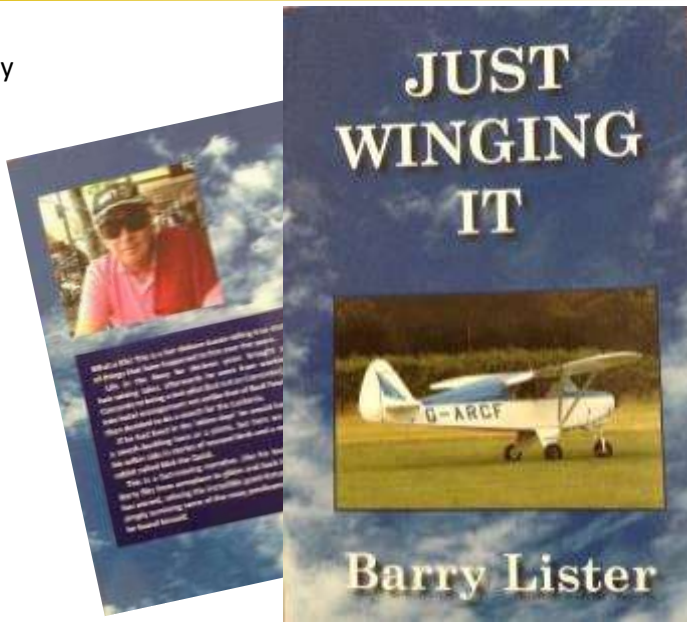

## Caring for the Community

In late 2018, HTK established a Social Welfare Committee to build up our ministry to people on the Sunshine Coast who were doing it tough, through homelessness and/or poverty. For some years we have supported the Maroochy Neighbourhood Centre with food and clothing, but it was felt that we needed to do more.

We commenced financially supporting the Wednesday night meal provided by St Peter's Anglican Church in Maroochydore, and in 2019, we commenced our own Community Breakfast on Tuesday mornings. We have also provided some support for Rosies who provide services to the homeless in Caloundra. We have also been involved in meetings and forums looking at the dreadful shortage of affordable housing and shelters on the Sunshine Coast.

While our Tuesday morning breakfasts started off slowly, our perseverance and prayer paid off, as we now have a community of up to 40 people who avail themselves of bacon and eggs, sausages, baked beans, toast, cereals, fruit and tea and coffee. A number of students in need from the high school have been joining us as well supported by their School Chaplain. We received a lovely card from the students at the end of term.

This ministry has grown rapidly, and patrons are served by a team of four people on a roster. The breakfast runs from 8am til 10am, with team members setting up from 7.30am. This is a most rewarding ministry, fulfilling one of Jesus's commands to feed the hungry.

A special breakfast on Christmas Eve included generous Christmas hampers and Coles gift cards. Thank you to all those who donated food and money for this, including Shadforth Civil and Kellie Payne Financial Solutions.



Funding for the breakfasts and other activities of the Social Welfare Committee is generated by our quarterly Bunnings sausage sizzles and cake/jam stalls. Our next Bunnings event is on Saturday 7 March, and as usual, we rely very heavily on support and volunteers from our HTK family. Thank you to Coles Caloundra who provide a discount for our purchases for the Bunnings sausage sizzle.

We are also grateful for those parishioners who donate money towards our breakfasts. We are particularly grateful to Cris and Lee-Anne Geri from Rawganix Farm who are now donating eggs for our breakfast.

Thank you to all the volunteers who help at the breakfasts, who help with the Bunnings stalls, and who donate money, food and clothing to our ministry to those doing it tough. This is a ministry of HTK which we are all a part of, which is done in the name of the church, and which is done in God's name.
