Pastor's Pen



Dear HTK Parish Family,

"Silent Night, Holy Night"

What is your favourite Christmas carol? Mine is "Silent Night, Holy Night." The reason I have liked it, even from my childhood, is that it is full of peace, beauty and the utter radiance of heaven. Sung by candlelight, especially at the end of a Christmas Eve worship service, it touches a chord deep within my heart.

At the end of the year that was completely disturbed by Covid-19, it is wonderful to be entering into that special time of year when peace abounds. Covid-19 and the restrictions were not all bad though. Many people discovered the value of living a quieter, more family-focussed life.

For many Christians, the lockdown period was a time when they drew closer to God and came to value alternate Spiritual practices. For me, one of the Spiritual practices that I grew in appreciation of, was the practice of silence, of being quiet before God and just listening, to try and hear that still, small voice as Elijah did on the top of Mt. Sinai.

I found the practice of silence very refreshing and helped me grow closer to God. In October, I attended a Diocesan Retreat for Clergy at Ormiston on the theme, "Treasure in Jars of Clay- Beauty and Brokenness." Our retreat leader was Bishop Matt Brain of Bendigo who lead us via pre-recorded sessions. His opening talk was on making the most of silence.

He gave us five points as to why we need silence:

- 1. The pace of modern life doesn't let our neurochemistry replenish. Silence restores it.
- 2. Ministry's demands never seem to end. (You can make you own substitute here). Ministers enjoy mowing the lawn because it is something finished and done. Ministry never seems to be. Silence is a cut-off point.
- 3. Wisdom requires reflection to know what the information means. Heaps of information is available today.
- 4. We tend to speak too soon and listen too little. We need time to listen in silence.
- 5. God demands an audience. We need to stop talking and listen to God.

He then gave us five points on entering into silence.

- 1. We need to make time for silence to quieten the inner chatter.
- 2. We need to engage the other senses. When we are always talking, we do not develop our other senses and we can damage our hearing.
- 3. We need to start with a plan as to how we will listen and be willing to change it.
- 4. Bishop Matt suggests read, think, pray, do something physical (short walk, push-ups!!), sit and then repeat.
- 5. Write a letter or a song. By engaging pen and paper, you also involve others.

Life is busy for many people. Even retired people tell me that they are so busy, they wondered how they ever found time to work. Most people live life at breakneck speed. Running here, going there, doing this, doing that. There is no greater time of the year that this happens than at Christmas- all of the present buying, all of the parties, all of the break-ups, all of the cooking, all of the preparation and so on and so on and son on!!

Christmas will be so busy for most people that they won't hear the cry, the cry of a newborn baby born about 2,000 years ago and laid in a manger in a stable. It seems such a long time ago. It seems such a faint cry now. But, if you stop and if you listen, you will hear that cry, that cry that not only brings you salvation but gives you wisdom, guidance and direction in all aspects of your life. If only we could listen. If only we could be still.

It was on a silent night that that baby's cry pierced the stillness of that night and the world has never been the same again. As you celebrate Christmas this year, take time to stop, be still and enter into the silence to hear the voice of God who spoke to us and still speaks to us through his Son. As you travel through 2021, make silence a part of your Spiritual practice and take the peace, beauty and utter radiance of heaven with you through the coming year as you enter deep into the heart of God and his Son, Jesus. Your own little bit of Christmas, each and every day.

May you all have a very happy, holy and safe Christmas with your family and friends and every blessing for the New Year,






Supplication


